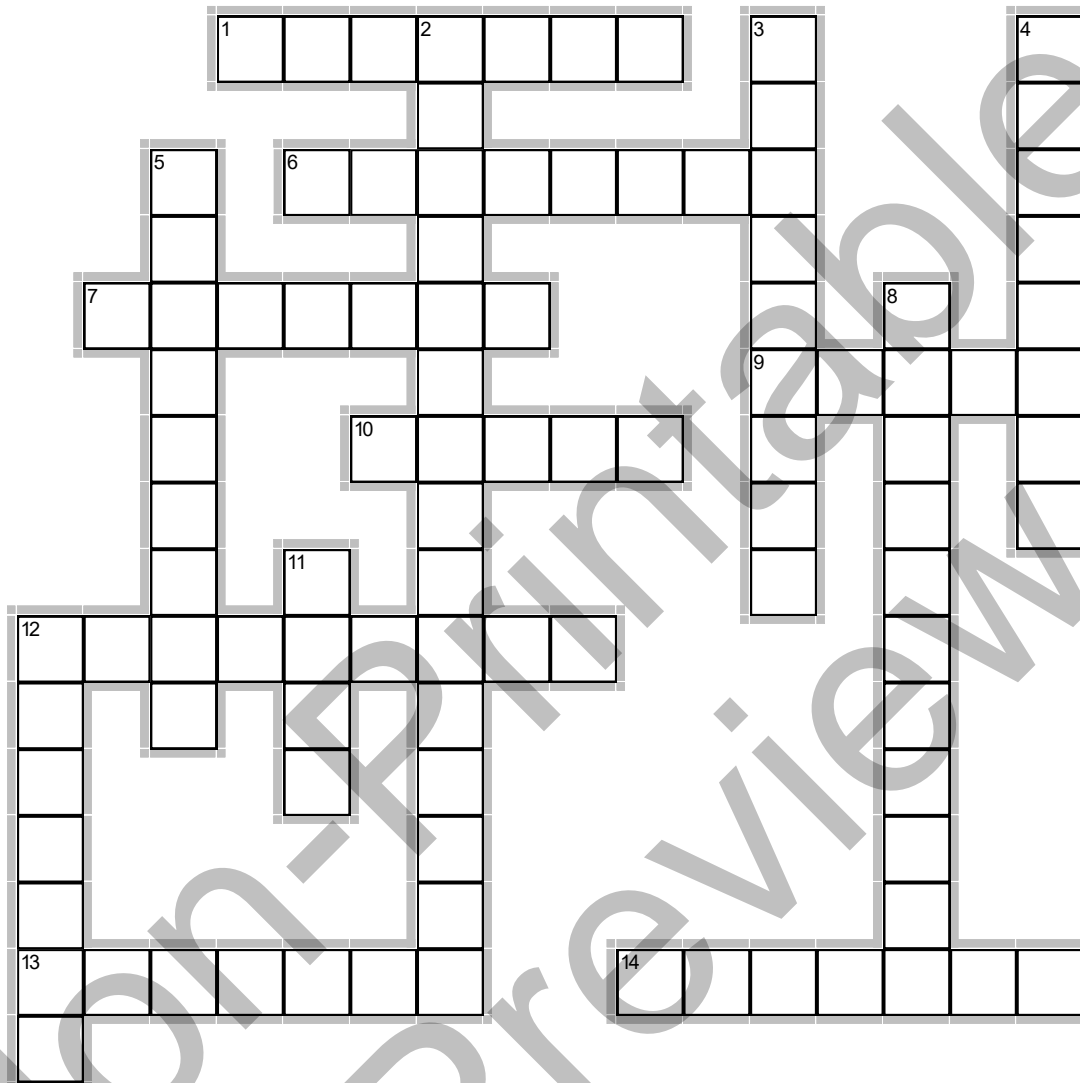

African elephants in danger

Africa's elephants are in danger of becoming (1) _____. Increased poaching on the continent is putting Africa's elephants in danger. Last year about 20000 elephants were killed. Especially in central African countries, elephant (2) _____ are down to alarming numbers. In the next ten years the population could be cut by more than quarter.

At the beginning of the 20th (3) _____ there were about 10 million African elephants, now there are about 500 000. The rate of killings is higher than the (4) _____ birth rate.

However, governments in Africa are taking harsh steps to crack down on (5) _____. Kenya and Tanzania have arrested more illegal traders than ever before. Ivory is also confiscated at an increasing rate. Last year 40,000 kilos of (6) _____ were seized, mostly in Kenya, Tanzania and Uganda. For the first time more ivory was seized in Africa than in Asia, its primary destination. Female elephants are at a higher risk because they have especially large (7) _____.

Conservationists, however, are not so optimistic. They say that even though more ivory is captured, poaching is still on the (8) _____.

The (9) _____ for elephant ivory in China is especially high. It has become even more (10) _____ than gold, selling at thousands of dollars per kilo on Asian markets. In China, ivory is a multi-billion-dollar trade. The expensive material is used in medicine and for (11) _____.

Although the international ivory trade has been banned since 1989, poaching rings have been ruthlessly operating across the (12) _____ of many African countries. Towards the end of the 1990s the ivory ban was somewhat loosened to allow some countries to sell off their stockpiles. Critics see this as a major mistake.

Poverty in many African states lures the local population into taking part in elephant poaching. Soldiers in some countries are reported to be (13) _____ in the killings of elephants.
